



PORT AUGUSTA FORESHORE DISCOVERY

Adjacent to Port Augusta's main shopping district, the Eastside Foreshore boasts BBQ's, half-court basketball facility, playground, fully automated public toilet, a jetty for fishing and pontoons for swimming and boat mooring. The Swimmers Memorial Garden located on the Foreshore is a popular place for weddings.

For this activity, we want you to visit the Eastside area in Port Augusta, locate the information signs, and try to answer the following questions!

What was the earliest jetty called and what year was it constructed?

What was the largest jetty built in the South used for?

When were the five southern jetties replaced?



Task 2: Find the 'AFGHAN CAMELEERS IN AUSTRALIA' sign

Who owned Beltana Station and where was he from?

When was the drought that destroyed a quarter of the sheep in the Flinders Ranges?

Which city and country did Elder ride camels?

Which country did Elder import camels from to expand pastoralism in South Australia's North?

How many camels and Afghan camel handlers arrived at Port Augusta Warf and in what year?



Task 3: Find 'THE WHARF' Sign

What year was the wharf operational?

What were the most important products shipped from Port Augusta?
